What Defines Us?

Seven years ago, when I was first diagnosed with ovarian cancer, I wrote a newsletter article titled, *Not Defined by Cancer*. I continue to maintain that conviction.

For eight years I have served you as your pastor, and have been greatly blessed in doing so. Thank you for this opportunity. I have seen the love of Christ from you and through you. We have walked together through hard times and danced through celebrations. We have shared the Word in many and various ways and gathered at the table of the Lord to be fed His very presence in the bread and wine. We have pushed each other and uplifted one another. Thanks be to God for the community He gives us. Praise be to God for the community of Immanuel Lutheran Church.

It is hard for me to step back from serving as your pastor now. It is not what I desire, but what I need. Please know that even in this time, when I am not working, you remain in my heart and my prayers, as I know you hold me in yours.

Thank you for allowing me this disability leave, and for your support for Pastor Steve as he and you together discern how to make sure all the ministry needs are met. Thank you for using your gifts to that end, and for working with and encouraging Cheryl Dix as council president, the executive committee, and all of the council and committees.

I don't know what will mark the end of my disability leave. Perhaps the disability leave will conclude with the fact that I will not be able to return to work — that the cancer will take over completely. We must admit that that is a real possibility. But I hope that I'll be able to return to work, and that that day will come soon. I'm feeling good right now, and seeing increased strength and ability each week. The doctor has said that the present chemo drug I'm on might give me several years of remission. We find hope in that.

But the truth is that we cannot rely on that. It is only a 50/50 chance based on limited experience and observation. Our ultimate hope is not in a drug, but in the *promise* that has been realized – the promise of life with Christ now and into eternity. He holds us in his love. Jesus is our Way, our Truth, and our Life, given for us to be in relationship with our Father, which has been established through Jesus' death and resurrection.

I have many favorite Bible passages and many favorite hymns (which are all based in scripture). One of those passages is Romans 14:8 – "If we live, we live to the Lord, and if we die, we die to the Lord; so then, whether we live or whether we die, we are the Lord's."

I stand firm in that promise.

Over these past years I have been asked many times how I'm doing. (Thank you for your sincere concern and expression of that.) My answer has typically been, "I'm doing well," or something similar. I have given that response even when I have felt lousy or have just gotten a not-so-good-report from the doctor; even when nausea has knocked me back, or I've been slowed

down by lethargy or weakness, or handicapped by "chemo brain". My response has been honest. I have been well because I know who holds me, and I know that it is not cancer that defines me. I am defined by the cross on my forehead and by my God and Lord who claimed me through His cross. I am defined by the promise that I know and which gives me peace and joy.

Hymns expound on the scripture that defines us, and certain ones speak to me in specific ways. Here are some phrases from some hymns that define me as a child of God, as one held by God, and they give me comfort and strength. Other hymns feed me in different ways, and I go to them in different times of need.

(If you have been on the Greenwood Reservoir sometime when I have been out there kayaking, perhaps you have heard me singing these as I've paddled along.)

When through fiery trials your pathway shall lie, My grace, all-sufficient, shall be your supply. The flames shall not hurt you; I only design Your dross to consume and your gold to refine.

..And then, when gray hairs shall their temples adorn Like lambs they shall still in my bosom be borne (How Firm a Foundation ELW #796)

Oh, let me nestle near thee, within thy downy breast Where I will find sweet comfort and peace within thy nest.

.... Oh, take into thy keeping thy children great and small And while we sweetly slumber

And while we sweetly slumber enfold us one and all.

(Thy Holy Wings ELW #613)










Sunday School finished off on an exciting note. We heard the story of Pentecost a little early, because our Sunday

The plan for Sunday School:





Fall Worship and Sunday School Time Changes

Our new Bishop-Elect is Pastor Katherine Finegan.

The Rev. Katherine A. Finegan was elected May 23, 2017, to serve a six-year term as bishop of the Northern Great Lakes Synod, ELCA. The election was held during the Syn-

od Assembly which took place at Messiah Lutheran Church and Northern Michigan University in Marquette, MI, on May 21-23. Bishop Tom Skrenes will retire as of September 1, at which time Pastor Katherine will assume that ministry.

Pastor Katherine has served as Assistant to the Bishop in the NGLS since February, 2012. Previously she served as pastor of Bethany Lutheran Church in Republic, MI, from 2002-2012, and as Youth Minister at Hope Lutheran Church in St. Paul, MN, from 1988-2000. She earned a Bachelor of Arts degree from Valparaiso University in Valparaiso, IN, in 1987, and received her Master of Divinity from Luther Seminary in St. Paul, MN, in 2002.

Pastor Katherine will be installed as the fourth bishop of the Northern Great Lakes Synod on Saturday, **October 21**st, **at 1:30 p.m**. at St. Peter's Cathedral in Marquette. A reception will immediately follow at the Holiday Inn from 3:00-5:30 p.m. All are welcome to attend both the installation service and reception.

NORTHERN GREAT LAKES WATER STEWARDS UPDATE

In July of 2016, a four-year interfaith initiative was launched to help deepen and enhance our understanding of the spiritual underpinnings of our region's environmental resources.

Since then, two community public presentations have been sponsored, 8 Public Service announcements (radio) distributed, 2 congregational adult forums facilitated, a delegation to Standing Rock supported, and 11 columns written by 9 different writers published in the Marquette Monthly.

This summer <u>our intention is to plant 500 Northern white cedar trees</u> in the community forest, part of the yellow-Dog Watershed Preserve. We invite local congregational members and youth to consider joining us for one or both of two planting projects, both on Saturday mornings, July 1 and July 29.

As our churches serch for ways to communicate our commitment to a healing and protection of this place we call our home, here is an on-Othe-ground opportunity. Those of you who may wish to commemorate a tree in someone's name, that can, and will be done. Names will be whispered and prayers lifted up as each designated seedling is placed in the ground. Donations for trees are \$5 a piece.

We have representatives of the Lutheran, Methodist, Jewish, Episcopal and Methodist traditions involved in this effort. In October we intend to invite an African-American pastor from Flint, Mig=chigan, to come and speak to our community about their faith-based work dealing with their community's water crisis.








Welcome to Church is Good!!

First of all, a word of confession. The Church is imperfect. It's full of sinners, after all. The Church is full of people who, with the best of intentions, still get it wrong. The Church does not exist or gather together because we have all the answers, or because we have life and love or God all figured out. We gather together to draw strength and wisdom from each other and from the Spirit of Christ who promises to live among us.

So we're doing the best we can. And we invite you to join us! We feel that Jesus meant the Church to be a blessing to the world. And His presence, embodied in the people who gather as Church, is on a mission to make a difference in His name, and that means a POSITIVE difference, MEANINGFUL, working together for something that MATTERS.



What words come to mind when you hear the term "Stewardship"? How about these:

JOY - SERVICE - SACRIFICE

Harper's Bible Dictionary defines a "steward" as follows: "From the Greek oekonomos, the manager of a large household or estate, who might be a slave. The name also designated a municipal officer (Romans 16:23). The steward had management of the children of the owner (Galatians 4:2). Jesus proposes the faithful steward as the example of the responsible Christian (Luke 12:42). The apostles are managers of the mysteries of God (I Cor. 4:1-2; Titus 1:7). The Christian is a steward of the grace of God (I Peter 4:10)."

Stewardship is our response to God, how we manage what God has entrusted to our care. We believe and we respond with our whole lives. As children of God, we share in the purpose and work of God. Stewardship is a conscious effort to show what is important to us. It's setting our priorities. Stewards are witnesses, sometimes silently, for showing what is important in life, including home, family, work, school, friends – not just what you do in your congregation. Stewardship is a way of life, a total response to God for all God's blessings. Our God blesses us abundantly! Everything we have – families, friends, homes, food, clothing, meaningful work – all are from God's gracious hand. How we choose to care for and use those blessings is what stewardship is all about. God has entrusted to our care the many things of this world. We don't own them; they are God's, to be used for God's purpose and work.

We respond to God's blessings in two ways: 1) First, as individuals: how we deal with people in our everyday lives, nurturing them with kindness and respect, or hurting them with anger and harsh words. We as individuals set up priorities by which we live and thus we become silent witnesses to where Christ belongs in our lives. 2) Secondly, we respond to God as partners with other Christians, sharing His word and will throughout our Church, our community, and the world.
